Day: 01 **Stockholm**

Arrival in Stockholm according to your own itinerary. Day at leisure to enjoy Stockholm. Explore the cities well-preserved medieval buildings that stands alongside modern architecture. Just outside the city, the archipelago of 24 000 islands is definitely worth visiting. Sights of interest include the Vasa Museum, Skansen Open Air Museum, City Hall and of course the Old Town (Gamla Stan). We recommend a sightseeing tour by buss or boat. Accommodation at Clarion hotel Stockholm

Day: 02 **Stockholm – Nynäshamn – Visby**

Breakfast at the hotel. Thereafter your journey continues by local train from Stockholm to Nynäshamn where the ferry to Visby departs. The ferry transports you to Gotland from the Swedish mainland in approximately 3 hours. After arrival, check in at the Clarion Hotel Wisby. In the afternoon we suggest a stroll through the city to see the Ruins, 17th century wooden houses, the Cathedral of St: Mary and the famous Ring wall. The Ring wall is over 700 years old and 3.5 km long. In Visby, nothing is very far away.
